

#### **Kids Can Catch**

Once again, our flagship event took place on a beautiful day on June 3, 2023. This year was a bit different, however. The LFGA was proud to stand with our partners at the City of Lacombe and Lacombe County for the grand opening of one of Alberta's few, fully accessible fishing docks. We had an estimated 500 participants on hand to celebrate; with many known to have travelled from both Calgary and Edmonton, and areas in between. Lots of local and industry media also attended the event. Once again, the highlight of the day is the trout release where kids are able to physically release 500 trout into the pond. Fishing equipment is available to all to borrow for the day, LFGA volunteers help teach first time anglers, many prizes are given away and every participant is fed a free hot lunch. And most importantly, smiles are everywhere...


#### **Cenalta Youth Conservation Academy**

This year saw another successful camp in July with more than 30 youths being educated on all things conservation at the LFGA Conservation property located on the edge of Chain Lakes in Ponoka County. LFGA & Cenalta volunteers help to educated and train on several hunting, fishing and conservation education. The LFGA also maintains and manages the camp facilities on the property that include several sleeping cabins and a main lodge.

#### Len Thompson Trout Pond – Accessible Dock Project COMPLETE!

Only two years ago, the Len Thompson Trout Pond had a small, old and unstable dock that had a tendency to sink. Now, only two years later, anglers have many opportunities to get closer to the fish. Two new floating docks were installed in the fall of 2022 and our new, fully accessible fishing dock was ready for anglers just in time for the Kids Can Catch day!








This dock is 100 feet long and 100 feet wide, has 79 steel piles that were installed (on ice) and has approximately 3400 square feet of deck space. Plenty of room for activities! We were thrilled to see a kid catching a rainbow trout off the dock just before the ribbon cutting.




